How do I register to vote?

1. Fill in the form attached to this leaflet.
2. Make sure **you** sign the declaration.
3. Return your completed form as soon as possible to your electoral registration office. You can find the address at www.aboutmyvote.co.uk

Register as soon as you can, or it may be too late to vote in the next election.

Who can register to vote?

- anyone 16 or over (but you cannot vote until your 18th birthday)
- British or qualifying Commonwealth citizens. Qualifying Commonwealth citizens are those who have leave to enter or remain in the UK or do not require such leave.
- citizens of the Republic of Ireland or other European Union member states

How can I vote?

You can vote in one of **three** ways.

- **In person** – at your local polling station on election day. You will receive a poll card before the election telling you where and when to vote.
- **By post** – if you want your ballot paper sent to you. This is useful if you think you will be away from your registration address on election day.
- **By proxy** – if you want someone else to vote on your behalf. You must have a reason to vote by proxy, for example, if you are going to be abroad on election day.
